

Change to Medication Request Form – Type 2 Diabetes

Please read the notes below before completing this form

Our records indicate that when you first registered with the National Diabetes Services Scheme (NDSS), you were diagnosed as not requiring an injectable medication to manage your diabetes. We have noted, however, that your recent NDSS order included a request for syringes and/or injection needles. As a result, we are assuming that your diabetes management regime may have changed. Under the terms of our contract with the Australian Government to administer the NDSS, we are not able to supply syringe or needle products unless we have been informed of your needs in writing and those needs have been confirmed by a medical practitioner.

Change of status can be verified in one of two ways:

1. A letter from a health professional, including CDE on official letterhead, confirming the need for insulin, or other authorised injectable medication used to manage your diabetes
2. A copy of the prescription for medication or a repeat
